Virtual:

- Volunteers will be asked to engage in activities such as:
 - Tutoring and mentoring (virtual or in-person)

 - Other responsibilities as directed by teachers/administrators
- Time Commitment:
 - Volunteers are asked to identify the amount of time they are willing to commit to the program
 - Volunteers can opt to set specific hours for assistance, or be available as needed
 - Please communicate with your teacher/administrator if you are going to be unavailable during a period of time
 - We would ask that volunteers remain involved for the duration of the Fall 2020 semester
 - Approximately 3-5 hours per week

- Time Commitment:
 - o Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:15-4:15 at Martin Enrichment Academy
 - We would ask that volunteers remain involved for the duration of the 2020-21 academic year
- Background Checks:
 - o In order to engage in *in-person* tutoring/mentoring, you must undergo a background check
 - o Accompanied with a fee, approximately \$35
 - o More information will be provided upon completion of the volunteer form
